## Winter Meeting

Because most of us would rather spend our time flying, especially when we have indoor gym time, it sometimes is to our advantage to have a few advance thoughts about the business meeting that will take up important flying and socializing time. That way the business part can be kept to a minimum. The business items that will be brought up that we are aware of so far are (in no particular order):

**\*Insurance**--As the AKA is still struggling to find coverage for all its member (currently, buggiers and kite surfers are not included), the Kansas City Kite Club is enjoying a \$300,000.00 General Liability policy that is in force 24/7. We first bought the policy last year, and, thankfully, have not had to use it, but it is nice that it is there for us. Just in case. This policy is a primary policy, which means it will pay for liability damages before your homeowner's policy will need to. To keep this policy in effect we will need to vote the funds to pay the premium--\$250 per year.

**\*Flying Fields**--Since JUCO tore up our old, stable flying field, we have not established a new permanent home for 2nd Sunday Flies, but have instead enjoyed moving the location around. This has pros and cons. We have attracted new people interested in kite flying by using new locations, but many of these flies have not been well attended. As a result the Executive committee needs members feedback. What would the members like to do? Do we need to name a permanent flying field, or check the website for a new location each month? Perhaps a compromise? Name a permanent flying field for even months, but try new places in odd months. What would work best for YOU?

**\*Pins**-- It has been a while since KCKC has updated its club pins. Linda Larkey would like to order a new club pin featuring Chuck Blackwell's KCKC logo that we have adopted as our own. These pins have a minimum order of 100 pins (@2.49 each) but a significant price break when ordering 300 (@1.54 each). Currently the KCKC has about 50 families who are members. Each options will take an initial outlay of cash, but the pins should pay for themselves. We could institute a program of a new pin every year or two featuring a different kite each year. These pins would have interest for other kiting clubs, since pin trading is a fun way to mark a kiter's travels and interests.
