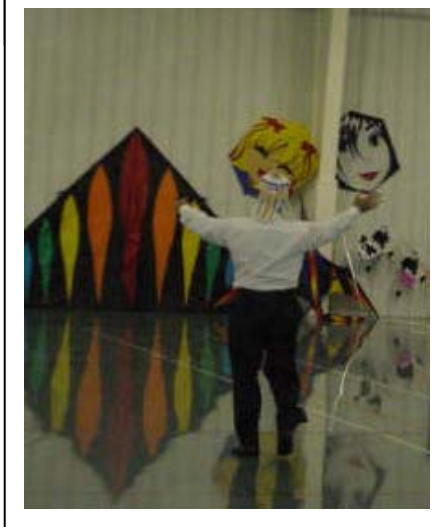

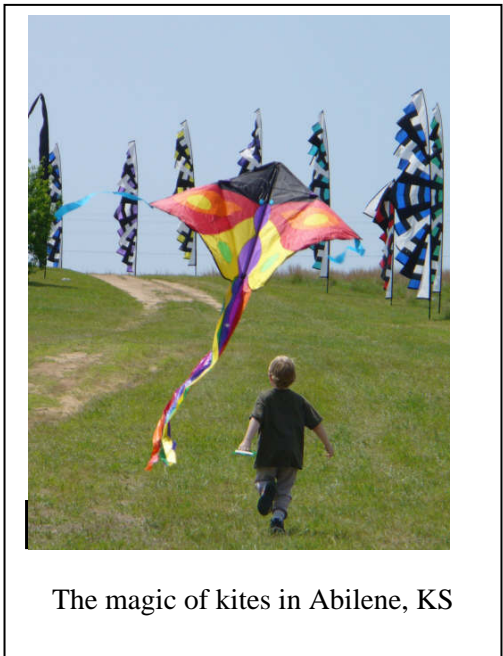

August 16, 2008 KITEBUILDERS WORKSHOP—Dave Ellis

Saturday, Call Dave Ellis to reserve your spot, and/or for any information.

Home: 913-648-4925 Cell: 913-908-8327 Class will be at Dave's home, start at noon, and build time is approximately 8 hours. Participants can finish at home if they wish to leave earlier. I have a new kite that I have been working on. It is my interpretation based on a kite developed by Halit in Istanbul, Turkey. (He is a member of the Kitebuilder.com forum.) I have been invited to present this kite at OKR in January, 2009. For practice in presenting this kite, I am offering a class at the local level. The class will be free, and have limited enrollment. You will provide your own materials. However, I can provide the materials, but those are not free. Material needed is 10 yards of light weight ripstop. Or 1 yard of ripstop, and 10 yards of lightweight, soft material, like taffeta suit lining material, or Organza, or.... You will need 3 fiberglass or carbon rods each at 32.5 inch length. I prefer carbon. (.1880 or .21 diameter. Or whatever you wish.) You need end caps for the rods. A lot (200 feet, or so.) of 1 inch wide, 3/4 oz ripstop ribbon. (This can be cut from regular ripstop, or ordered on a roll from Kite Studio.) Or you can omit the ribbon, and just double fold all the edges. I can provide the hook and loop material (aka Velcro, if you can tolerate tan color. I can also provide the webbing for pockets, if you can tolerate black or white, recycled material.) I can provide all the materials for you, if you choose the rolled edges option. The cost of materials per kite should be \$45. I think the class at OKR, where I will have to gather all materials, and ship them to Oregon; the class will be closer to \$60 per person. (Unless it costs more than I estimated when actual ordering takes place.) The class will be held Saturday, August 16th. This is NOT a 4 hour class. It will take appx. 8 hours to complete, but much of that can be done at home, later. (The tails, and/or appliqué, take a lot of time, but are simple to make.) You can bring your machine, or you can rent one of mine. I have 5, now. Class limit will be 4 people. If a larger group is interested, we could possibly make arrangements to meet elsewhere. I doubt that will be required.

We will be working at my home, all inside. No outside cutting required. Starting time will be Noon, and will last as long as you wish to work. Call to reserve your spot, and/or for any information.

Colorful kites showcasing all types of whimsical and magical creations will fill the skies at the Second Annual DeKalb Kite Festival Sunday, Sept. 14th, 11 a.m.-4 p.m. A barrel kite five stories high and 50-feet across is among the featured kites (weather permitting). It is so massive; it takes a large truck or piece of heavy construction equipment to hold it in place, according to event organizers.
